Meeting Minutes

January 2024

The meeting was held virtually via Google Meet on January 20, 2024.

President, Jean Liestman called the meeting to order at 1:02. Members present in were: J. Liestman, L. Frenchick, J. Liestman, D. Michaelis, K. Frenchick, A. Schleper, G. Schleper, M. Lieser and L. Loch.

There was a motion made to approve the minutes as published in the last newsletter by Laura L. and a second by Audrey S.

Treasurer Report:

Prior to the meeting, Valerie emailed reports including the year end financials to the officers and board. Via email, Valerie reported the following:

- A few "offset" accounts were added to the Youth, Royalty, Ambassador, and Tri-State membership accounts for when donations come in. This offset of the expenses can more easily be seen what the actual expenses were, which should make budgeting easier.
- The \$200 from the convention expense budget to the Ambassador budget for 2023 (as was discussed at the October meeting) were not moved. Since the Ambassador account did not go over its budget in 2023, moving the numbers was not needed.
- The proposed budget loss for 2023 was \$3,000. Our actual "loss" was \$665 (rounded).

COMMITTEE REPORTS

June Show:

Lynda F. gave an update on the June show.

- Showbill Committee
 - -The showbill is close to being finalized and the committee has made a few changes/additions to the showbill for 2024.
 - 1. Ranch Horse classes will follow WSCA rules and include one Ranch Rail Pleasure class and one Ranch Riding class.
 - 2. Four additional classes have been added which are, Open Pony Halter 54" & Under, Open Color Halter, Schooling Walk-Trot/Jog and Schooling Walk-Trot-Canter/Lope.
 - 3. Some of the W/T classes have been removed from the class list, as well as combining some of the 13 & Under with the 14-17 classes.
 - 4. Classes containing 6 or more exhibitors maybe eligible for the Roll of the Die —money winning classes.
- Judges
 - Stacey Busswitz and Josh Tjosaas will receive a copy of the showbill once it's complete.
- Volunteers
 - Darcie M. has volunteered to be the ring steward.
 - Laura L. will volunteer where needed.
 - The 4-H Horse Judging teams that NMAHA sponsored should be contacted for being volun teers.
- Sponsorships
 - As always, sponsorships are a big need for this show to continue.

Ambassador Program:

Jean L. reported that the awards are being finalized.

- There are 14 adults and 2 youth in the Hands and Hooves program.
- There are 4 adults and 1 youth participating in the Ambassador program.
- The discussion of adding a third division for non-registered Arabians/Part Arabians to the Hands & Hooves program has been table until a later date.

Royalty Program:

- Changes have been made to the 2025 Guidelines/Application to update the verbiage pertaining to not holding show in May currently.
- Prior the meeting, the updated form and the promotional royalty ad was sent to Lynda F. to put on the NMAHA website.

Arabians Unplugged:

Jaime L. reported on AU.

- It was approved to expand the AU circuit, which would allow non-Arabian clubs to participate. The new rules and forms were updated and Laura Mickelson will be making people aware of this when she emails the calendar out with show dates of clubs. Laura M. also announced this at the last Region 10 meeting. Jaime L. and Jean L. will help promote this addition.

Region 10

Jean L., Kaitlyn F. and Lynda F. attended the Region 10 virtual meeting. Kaitlyln L. gave an overview of the meeting.

- Elections for Region 10 are coming up.
- The Region 10 show size increased in 2023.
- Kaitlyn F. is stepping down as the Region 10 Youth Coordinator.

I am the NMAHA representative for the Arabians Unplugged circuit that rewards amateurs and youth showing in non-rated Arabian shows, where I sit on the steering committee and help with presenting the awards at the banquet.

Breeding, raising, and training Arabians and Part-Arabians on our farm, Reflection Farm, has been a lifelong business that I have had the pleasure of being a part of, thanks to my mother, Jean Liestman. We stand several stallions at stud and dedicate our lives to ensuring the needs of the horses we care for are met, as well as their owner's.

I have shown both Arabians and Part-Arabians to local, state, national and world titles. One of the top highlights of my horse career, was when RF RAMBO, a Part-Arabian Pinto stallion, who I grew up alongside, showed and loved was inducted into the

Pinto Horse Association of America Equine Hall of Fame. This was such an honor and an emotional time receiving this award in Tulsa, OK. It was a moment of a lifetime that I will forever cherish. My first Purebred Arabian was a grey gelding, Marwan+, who I had the joy of riding at the young age of three. The world needs more horses like him to take care of and protect youth riders.

I am not shy when it comes to volunteering and sharing my love of the Arabian horse. When time allows, I promote Arabians/Half-Arabians by attending WSCA Open shows, which allows me to be an ambassador for our association and as a perk, be active in the NMAHA Ambassador Program. In 2016 and 2023, I received the NMAHA President's Award and I received the AHA Club Level Volunteer Award, also in 2023. I try to provided many of my riding lesson students a way to love and appreciate the Arabian horse and several have gone on to participate in shows through my guidance and encouragement.

Community involvement helps to stay connected to those around you. Being active in both Cornerstone Church and Salem Historical Church are very rewarding for me. I am also involved in the Litchfield community through Danner, Brekke & Everts Financial and Insurance Solutions, where I have been


