How long have you been involved with the Arabian Horse?

I've been involved since 1972. I bred Warbaby to Sir Ferzon to produce Lady Ferdawn, a part-bred filly foaled in 1975. My 3/4 Arabian mare, Taney was bred to Ibn Raffon to produce one of my early winning show mares, Taan Raffona, who was foaled in 1976. It is difficult to pinpoint a favorite Arabian or Part-Arab horse that I've been involved with or have owned. The mares, Taan Raffona, PA Shetanna, PA Sunday Silk (Silky), PA Silken Rose (Rose), PETS Troubled Rose (Trouble), the gelding PETS Silk Illusion (Louie), and of course my stallions, Ramachis, PA Baloo Velvet (Velvet) and PA Rhapsodynbaloo (Rhapsody). But I will choose PETS Troubled Rose, since she is the only one still alive. She also won the most money.

What is your favorite part of working with or owning an Arabian or Part-Arabian Horse?
